Omnibus Motion

Motion:

Move to adopt the following provisions:

Departmentwide

- 1. Information Technology Systems Maintenance and Field Equipment Funding (Paper #516). Adopt Alternative A4 to provide \$131,000 environmental SEG each year in one-time financing for the high-capacity well application system and wastewater plan review system information technology projects. Adopt Alternatives B2 and B3 to provide \$87,100 SEG each year in one-time financing for replacement of information technology field equipment for staff in the Division of Environmental Management. (Funding would include \$47,700 environmental SEG, and \$39,400 petroleum inspection SEG each year.)
- 2. eGrants System Licensing and Support (Paper #517). Adopt Alternative 3 to provide \$350,000 (\$245,000 split-funded conservation SEG and \$105,000 split-funded environmental SEG) in 2026-27 for eGrants system post-procurement costs. In addition, delete \$4,200 GPR, \$19,800 snowmobile SEG, and \$23,400 split-funded conservation SEG in 2026-27 related to LTE salaries allotments and fringe benefits.
- 3. Property Asset Management System and Building Demolition (Paper #518). Adopt Alternative B1 to create a GPR continuing appropriation for building demolition and provide the appropriation \$500,000 GPR in 2025-26 for building demolition projects.
- 4. Online All-Terrain and Utility Terrain Vehicle Map (Paper #519). Adopt Alternative 1 to provide \$1,000,000 ATV SEG one-time funding in 2025-26 for the development of an online, application-based, trail map for ATV and UTV routes.
- 5. Snowmobile Account Condition (Paper #520). Adopt Alternative 1 to lapse the unencumbered balance on June 30, 2025, from the snowmobile trail and project aids appropriation under s. 20.370(5)(cr) of the statutes to the balance of the snowmobile account.
- 6. Motorized Vehicle Appropriations Reestimates (Paper #521). Approve the following motorized vehicle SEG appropriations reestimates: (a) -\$445,700 in 2025-26 and -\$243,400 in 2026-27 for the snowmobile trail areas appropriation; (b) \$1,200 in 2025-26 and \$62,400 in 2026-27 for

the all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle project aids appropriation; and (c) -\$502,100 in 2025-26 and -\$227,700 in 2026-27 for the supplemental snowmobile trail aids appropriation.

- 7. Night and Weekend Differential Pay (Page 467, #4). Provide \$92,100 conservation SEG each year in additional funding for night and weekend differential pay costs.
- 8. GIS Licenses (Page 469, #9). Provide \$150,000 (\$139,200 split-funded conservation SEG and \$10,800 split-funded environmental SEG) each year for mobile geographic information systems (GIS), desktop GIS licensing, and unlimited server capacity.
- 9. Vacant Position Reductions. Delete 20.1 FTE positions vacant for more than 12 months, including 4.5 FED, 12.6 PR, and 3.0 SEG, and associated funding for salaries and fringe benefits, including \$365,900 FED, \$1,015,000 PR, and \$249,300 SEG.

Fish, Wildlife, and Natural Heritage Conservation

- 10. Kenosha Dunes Restoration Projects (Paper #535). Redirect \$6,000,000 in unobligated stewardship program bonding authority from 2023 Wisconsin Act 19 for the Kenosha Dunes restoration project.
- 11. Forestry Account Transfer to the Fish and Wildlife Account. Transfer \$15,000,000 forestry SEG each year on a one-time basis from the balance of the forestry account to the balance of the fish and wildlife account.

Forestry

- 12. Hazardous Tree Removal (Paper #542). Provide \$2,066,500 forestry SEG in 2025-26 and \$2,167,500 forestry SEG in 2026-27 on a one-time basis for contracting costs for hazardous tree removal on DNR-owned recreational properties.
- 13. Fire Suppression Services Funding and Overtime (Paper #543). Adopt Alternative A3 to provide \$1,220,400 forestry SEG in 2025-26 and \$1,062,000 forestry SEG in 2026-27 on a one-time basis for costs related to DNR wildfire suppression and prescribed burn efforts.
- 14. County Sustainable Forestry, County Forest Administrator, and County Forest Wildlife Habitat Grants (Paper #544). Adopt Alternative A1 to provide \$500,000 forestry SEG each year in additional funding for county sustainable forestry and county forest administrator grants. Adopt Alternative B1 to provide \$130,000 forestry SEG each year in additional funding for the county forest wildlife habitat grant program.
- 15. Wisconsin Private Forest Landowner Grants (Paper #545). Adopt Alternative 2 to provide \$45,100 forestry SEG each year in additional funding for the private forest landowner and weed management area grant programs.
- 16. Forestry Industrywide Strategic Plan (Page 491, #13). Create a continuing appropriation and provide \$1,000,000 forestry SEG on a one-time basis in 2025-26 to award a grant to the Great

Lakes Timber Professionals Association and the Wisconsin Paper Council to conduct a forestry industrywide strategic plan.

- 17. Forestry Software Licenses (Page 492, #15). Provide \$76,700 forestry SEG each year on a one-time basis for the purchase of software licenses for the DNR Division of Forestry.
- 18. Gypsy Moth Treatment (Page 492, #16). Provide \$230,000 forestry SEG each year on a one-time basis for the treatment of gypsy moths on DNR-owned properties.
- 19. *Iowa County Grant County Highway C*. Provide \$500,000 forestry SEG in 2025-26 for the state park, forest, and riverway roads appropriation. Specify that DNR provide a \$500,000 forestry SEG grant in 2025-26 from the state park, forest, and riverway roads appropriation for the construction and maintenance of County Highway C between State Highway 23 and U.S. Highway 14.
- 20. Rothschild Dam. Create a forestry SEG annual appropriation to provide financial assistance for the modernization of a dam on the Wisconsin River in the village of Rothschild. Provide \$42,000,000 forestry SEG in 2025-26 in program supplements for the Rothschild Dam.

Parks

- 21. Parks Development and Maintenance (Paper #551). Adopt Alternative 7 to reestimate s. 20.370(7)(fy) for federal resource acquisition and development monies by -\$4,900,000 FED each year.
- 22. Parks Operations Funding and Vehicle Admission Sticker Conversion Costs (Paper #552). Adopt Alternative A3 to provide \$1,394,400 (\$950,300 parks SEG, \$384,200 forestry SEG, and \$59,900 split-funded conservation SEG) in 2025-26 and \$1,435,700 (\$978,400 parks SEG, \$395,600 forestry SEG, \$61,700 split-funded conservation SEG) in 2026-27 to increase the Department's supplies and services allotment for operational costs in the state parks system. Adopt Alternative B1 to provide \$28,900 ATV SEG each year for ATV and UTV trail projects on DNR-owned lands. Provide \$18,600 forestry SEG each year for property-specific operations funding for the Lapham Peak Lodge in the Kettle Moraine State Forest.
- 23. Parks Technology Upgrades (Paper #553). Adopt Alternative A2 to provide \$458,900 (\$321,200 parks SEG and \$137,700 forestry SEG) each year, including \$404,900 each year in one-time funding, for technology upgrades for the state parks system.
- 24. Parks Maintenance Equipment Funding, Medical Training and Supplies (Paper #554). Adopt Alternative A3 to provide \$512,900 (\$358,500 parks SEG and \$154,400 forestry SEG) in 2025-26 and \$216,000 (\$151,000 parks SEG and \$65,000 forestry SEG) in 2026-27 for the purchase of maintenance equipment for the state parks system. Specify that the preceding amounts are provided on a one-time basis. Adopt Alternative B1 to provide \$267,000 (\$186,900 parks SEG and \$80,100 forestry SEG) in 2025-26 and \$35,000 (\$24,500 parks SEG and \$10,500 forestry SEG) in 2026-27 for medical training and supplies for staff of the state parks system. Specify that the preceding amounts are provided on a one-time basis.

- 25. Nonresident Campsite Fees Increase. Increase the maximum amount that DNR can charge for nonresident campsite fees from \$45 to \$50. Reestimate forestry SEG-REV by \$412,300 in 2026-27 and parks SEG-REV by \$1,204,400 in 2026-27. Provide \$1,204,400 parks SEG in 2026-27 for the parks and trails development appropriation.
- 26. Campsite Electricity Fees Increase. Increase the additional fee amount charged for campsites with an electric receptacle from \$15 to \$25 for Devil's Lake State Park, High Cliff State Park, Kohler-Andrae State Park, Peninsula State Park, and Willow River State Park. Increase the additional fee amount charged for campsites with an electric receptacle from \$10 to \$15 for other DNR-owned properties not specifically enumerated. Reestimate forestry SEG-REV by \$185,100 in 2026-27 and parks SEG-REV by \$1,350,200 in 2026-27. Provide \$1,350,200 parks SEG in 2026-27 for the parks and trails development appropriation.
- 27. State Parks System Nonresident Vehicle Admission Sticker Fees Increase. Increase the range of fees that DNR can charge: (a) \$9 for nonresident daily auto vehicle admission sticker fees to not less than \$19.85 but not more than \$24.85; (b) \$10 for nonresident daily bus to not less than \$24.85 but not more than \$29.85; and (c) \$4 for nonresident daily nursing home bus to not less than \$9.85 but not more than \$14.85. Increase the fee: (a) for nonresident annual vehicle admission stickers from \$37.50 to \$49.50; and (b) for nonresident additional annual from \$20 to \$32. Reestimate forestry SEG-REV by \$240,200 each year and parks SEG-REV by \$1,264,900 each year. Provide \$1,264,900 parks SEG each year for the parks and trails development appropriation.

Law Enforcement

- 28. Boating Safety and Enforcement Aids (Paper #561). Adopt Alternative 2 to provide \$320,400 boat SEG each year in additional funding for boating safety and enforcement aids.
- 29. Conservation Warden Overtime (Page 499, #2). Provide \$537,200 (\$418,500 split-funded conservation SEG, \$73,900 boat SEG, \$22,900 ATV SEG, \$5,600 water resources SEG, and \$16,300 environmental management SEG) in 2025-26 and \$596,700 (\$464,800 split-funded conservation SEG, \$82,000 boat SEG, \$25,500 ATV SEG, \$6,300 water resources SEG, and \$18,100 environmental management SEG) in funding for overtime costs for conservation wardens.

Waste, Remediation, and Air

- 30. Air Permit System (Paper #571). Adopt Alternative 1 to provide \$532,400 environmental management SEG as one-time funding in 2025-26 for the air permit application interface system.
- 31. Kewaunee March Remediation (Paper #572). Adopt Alternative 4 to provide \$2,000,000 environmental management SEG in 2025-26 in one-time funding to the state-funded spills response appropriation under s. 20.370(4)(dv) of the statutes for development of a remedial action plan for remediation of arsenic-contaminated sediment in the Kewaunee Marsh.
 - 32. Bonding for Great Lakes Contaminated Sediment Removal (Paper #573). Provide

\$7,500,000 GPR in 2025-26 as one-time funding for removing contaminated sediments in Lake Michigan, Lake Superior, and their tributaries.

- 33. Amcast Superfund Site (Paper #574). Adopt Alternative 1b to provide \$2,000,000 environmental management SEG each year in one-time funding from the state-funded spills response appropriation, s. 20.370(4)(dv) of the statutes, to be used for remedial action at the Amcast Superfund site.
- 34. Lapse Funding for Cleanup of Electronic Waste (Page 516, #7). Lapse the unexpended, unencumbered balance (\$1,450,000) of s. 20.370 (4)(hs), the continuing appropriation for electronic waste cleanup related to 5R Processors, to the environmental management account of the environmental fund.
- 35. Wisconsin Rapids East River Bank. Provide \$500,000 in 2025-26 in a new annual appropriation from the environmental management account to the City of Wisconsin Rapids for repair of a retaining wall as part of the Wisconsin Rapids Riverbank Project.
- 36. Lake Vista Shoreline Stabilization. Provide \$2,200,000 in 2025-26 in a new continuing appropriation from local government SEG to the City of Oak Creek for environmental remediation and redevelopment of Lake Vista Park.

Water Quality

- 37. Wastewater Permit Database Update (Paper #582). Adopt Alternative 1 to provide one-time GPR funding of \$442,000 in 2025-26 and \$693,600 in 2026-27 for an upgrade of the wastewater permitting data management system.
- 38. Dam Safety Bonding (Paper #583). Adopt Alternative 3b to provide \$4,000,000 GPR for dam safety grants in 2025-26.
- 39. Urban Nonpoint Source and Municipal Flood Control Programs (Paper #584). Adopt Alternative 3b to provide \$4,000,000 GPR for UNPS and MFC programs in 2025-26.
- 40. Rural Nonpoint Source Water Pollution Abatement (Paper #585). Adopt Alternative A2b to provide \$6,500,000 GPR for rural nonpoint source water pollution abatement grants in 2025-26. Adopt Alternative B1 and B3 to provide \$200,000 nonpoint SEG each year for nonpoint source grants to support nonstructural practices required of certain abatement projects on a one-time basis in the 2025-27 biennium.
- 41. Waterways System Maintenance (Page 527, #21). Provide \$109,400 environmental management SEG annually in one-time funding to improve DNR's waterways and wetlands information tracking system and waterways complaint system.
- 42. Brillion Marsh Dredging. Provide \$70,000 GPR in 2025-26 to DNR to perform a dredging project in the Manitowoc River in the Town of Brillion in Manitowoc County.

- 43. Highway Flooding. Provide \$100,000 nonpoint SEG in a new annual appropriation in 2025-26 to the Town of Norway in Racine County to assist with the mitigation of water runoff from Highway 36.
- 44. Deerskin River Dredging. Provide \$1,750,000 SEG in 2025-26 in a new biennial appropriation from the environmental management account to dredge the Deerskin River.
- 45. Green Lake Association. Provide \$250,000 SEG in 2025-26 in a new continuing appropriation from the environmental management account to the Green Lake Association for the mitigation of phosphorus pollution in Green Lake, in the City of Green Lake.
