

Personal Care is the Most Cost-Effective Setting for Taxpayers

Support a 48% increase to the MA Personal Care Rate

Personal care agencies across the state report that the severe shortage of in-home caregivers is forcing older adults and people with disabilities out of their homes and into more expensive settings. **50% of personal care agencies surveyed by WPSA in 2025 say they have clients who have either been unnecessarily hospitalized or could not be discharged** to the community due to a lack of workers.

<u>Real World Example 1</u>: A personal care agency that serves Ozaukee, Waukesha, Kenosha and Racine counties reports that they have a client who was hospitalized for 4 months and then had to go to rehab due to a fall that occurred because of a lack of in-home caregivers.

<u>Real World Example</u> 2: An individual who receives personal care in Milwaukee County was unnecessarily hospitalized for 4 weeks because her personal care agency and others in the area are unable to find enough caregivers for her.

A May 9, 2022, report by the Department of Health Services showed **that care provided in the community is 44.91% cheaper than care provided in nursing homes.**
