**Rep. Joe Sheehan Reacts to Governor Evers' State of the State Address**

MADISON - Today, Governor Tony Evers delivered his State of the State Address in the Wisconsin State Capitol, where he highlighted the successes of the last year. Representative Joe Sheehan (D-Sheboygan) released the following statement:
