## **Brett Hulsey announces Write-in Campaign for the Democratic Governor Nomination – Goal to get \$1.8 Billion Tax Money Back for Children, Schools, Homeowners, Renters As Soon As Possible**

"Governor Evers' bipartisan 'Save Our Kids' rebate bill was the best way to help Wisconsin's struggling families and I am the only candidate left who supported that \$1.8 billion rebate and reinvestment bill," said Hulsey. "Wisconsin voters want a candidate to fight to get their fair share of the \$2.3 billion surplus."

Governor Tony Evers said, "Wisconsin's kids and schools desperately need \$900 million this year because Tom Tiffany and a few Republican and Democratic lawmakers chose to blow up a bipartisan plan to invest in our K-12 schools, lower property taxes, and help working families afford rising costs, all because they'd rather do what's best for the next election than what's right for the people of our state."

"I am sorry I did not get on the ballot so I am doing a write-in campaign to fight for my grandchildren and all Wisconsin families to invest in our children, property taxpayers, renters, and workers," said Hulsey, a former state representative who debated the Tiffany/Walker "Unfair Despair" Act 10 bill that took almost a billion dollars from our school children, workers, healthcare and retirement. Hulsey then ran for Governor in 2014 against Scott Walker and got 51,300 votes in the Democratic primary.

President Trump backed GOP candidate U.S. Rep. Tom Tiffany called \$1.8 billion "chicken feed."

"The Governor Evers deal is a good step to help families struggling with the high costs from the Trump/Tiffany Iran War, high gas prices, food, and bills. It returns some of the school money former State Rep. Tom Tiffany and Gov.
