Rep. Brill has Bills Signed Empowering Law Enforcement and the Protection of Wisconsin Children

Madison – Today, Governor Tony Evers signed two bills authored by Representative Lindee Brill (R-Sheboygan Falls) into law: Assembly Bills 957 and 958. These bills came from the work of the Assembly Speaker’s Task Force on Protecting Kids, chaired by Representative Brill. They authorize and fund four new full-time positions for the Department of Justice’s Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force: two ICAC criminal analysts, one ICAC outreach specialist, and one ICAC digital evidence examiner. Both bills passed the Assembly and Senate unanimously.

Representative Brill offered the following comment about the signing of these bills into law:

“These bills are a critical step in the right direction, but we know there’s more work to be done. As a mother, I am passionate about the need to defend future generations and protect the innocent of the State of Wisconsin. I want to extend my profound thanks to the heroes of the Wisconsin Department of Justice’s Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, who tirelessly carry the burden of this grueling but vital work to bring the perpetrators of these vile crimes to justice and protect our kids.”

These bills are widely supported by law enforcement, including the Wisconsin District Attorneys’ Association, whose past president, Eric Toney (District Attorney of Fond du Lac County), spoke in favor of the bills at a joint press availability on February 17th with Representative Lindee Brill and Senator Jesse James (R-Thorp), the Senate author of the bills.
